

Scott County Board of Supervisors
August 27, 2024 8:30 a.m.

The Board of Supervisors met as a committee of the whole and pursuant to adjournment with Paustian, Rawson, Beck and Dickson present. Supervisor Maxwell joined online.

Executive Director of the Mississippi Valley Workforce Development Board Miranda Swafford gave a presentation on the Mississippi Valley Workforce Area. Strategic Partnership Specialist Tyler Lanz and Compliance Officer Mandy Tripp also reviewed programs, funding, services, and their new Skillup program.

County Engineer Angie Kersten reviewed the first of three readings to amend Scott County Code of Ordinances, Chapter 13 – Traffic Code, to designate engine and compression brake restrictions on specific county roads. She reviewed the higher amount of truck traffic on Highway 61 between Y48(110th Street) and I-280 since the addition of the Kwik Star and other businesses.

Kersten also reviewed a change in Federal Functional Reclassification of a Secondary Road. The County portion of 205th Street is aggregate. The road connects Bettendorf and Le Claire and has become a highly traveled route including semis and Ambulances. The change would allow for application for grant funding to assist in upgrading the road.

Kersten also presented an update on a Utility Permit that was issued.

Fleet Manager Mark Garrow reviewed the Purchase of one (1) 2024 Ford F350 Super Duty 4x4 Regular Cab Dump Truck with snowplow and spreader. This is an additional truck to help with the MEDIC locations and delivery is planned within approximately 5 months.

Garrow also reviewed the Purchase of one (1) 2023 John Deere 210P Excavator for Secondary Roads. This replaces a 2000 John Deere Excavator with over 7,000 hours. The one-year-old new machine saves approximately \$17,000 compared to a 2024 model and includes the same options.

Director of Planning and Development Greg Schaapveld reviewed a 28E Agreement with City of Princeton regarding building permits. He also reviewed there are no capacity concerns regarding the increase in inspections and they are prepared to take over starting next week. He also reviewed they currently have six active permits in Princeton.

Director of Facilities and Support Services Tammy Speidel reviewed the Courthouse Lower-Level Sump Pump Project. She reviewed the previous attempts to remediate the water issues. She also reviewed the contractor has done previous projects with the county.

Speidel also reviewed the Concrete repair projects around the downtown campus. She reviewed this includes the Administration Building entrance, a portion of the 5th street parking lot, and some areas at the 503 Scott Street facility.

Auditor Kerri Tompkins reviewed an over hire for the Auditor's Office.

Director of Human Resources Vanessa Wierman reviewed staff appointments.

Wierman also reviewed Teamsters FTO supplemental pay extension.

County Administrator Mahesh Sharma reviewed the Consideration of Board appointment to the Condemnation Appraisal Jury.

Sharma also reviewed one (1) renewal for a Class C Retail Alcohol License for Valley Inn, 24575 Valley Drive, Pleasant Valley, IA and one (1) renewal for Special Class C Retail Alcohol License for Cinnamon Ridge, Inc., 10600 275th Street, Donahue, IA.
