

Scott County Board of Supervisors  
February 26, 2026 5:02 p.m.

The Board of Supervisors met pursuant to adjournment with Maxwell, Paustian, Beck and Dickson present. Supervisor Bribiesco joined online. The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Beck a motion approving the minutes of the February 10, 2026 Committee of the Whole and the February 12, 2026 Board Meeting. All Ayes.

Upon review of the Agenda, Supervisor Dickson would like item #15 removed until a later date, the remaining supervisors agreed to vote on the item at a future meeting.

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Beck that the following six consent agenda items be approved. All Ayes.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the contract for FY2026 pavement markings for Secondary Roads be awarded to Vogel Traffic Services, Orange City, Iowa, at the unit prices set forth in the contract documents. 2) That the Chairperson is hereby authorized to execute the contract documents on behalf of the Board. 3) That this resolution shall take effect immediately. (21-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the Fleet Manager has the authority to purchase one (1) new and unused MY2026 Chevy Silverado 3500HD pickup with initial upfitting for MEDIC EMS, from Karl Emergency Vehicles through the State of Iowa, Department of Administrative Services (DAS) Vehicle Contract Catalog for a total cost of \$79,600.39. 2) Asset is a new addition to the fleet. 3) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (22-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The purchase of four hundred (400) Hewlett-Packard desktops from RTI in the amount of \$411,600 is hereby approved. 2) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (23-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The appointment of Cierra Simmons for the position of Critical Care Paramedic at step 2 with an hourly rate of \$29.48. 2) That she accrue 2 weeks of vacation annually. (24-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the terms of the agreement reached between representatives Scott County and the American Federation of State, County, Municipal Employees is hereby approved. That the agreement for FY27 wages shall be in effect July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027. 2) That the terms of the agreement reached between representatives Scott County and the Public Professional Maintenance Employees, Local 2003 is hereby approved. That the agreement for FY27 wages shall be in effect July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027. 3) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (25-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The Scott County Board of Supervisors approves for payment all warrants numbered 345646 through 345900 as submitted and prepared for payment by the County Auditor, in the total amount of \$2,388,139.35. 2) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (26-2026)

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Beck that the following resolution (27-2026) be approved. Roll Call: Four Ayes with Paustian voting Nay.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That on May 11, 2023, the Board approved and awarded a contract to Thompson Truck & Trailer, Davenport, Iowa, in the amount of \$233,860 for the purchase of two (2) tandem axle International HV-513 cab and chassis for Secondary Roads. 2) That Thompson Truck & Trailer was subsequently acquired by Ascendance Truck Centers, which is the successor entity administering the contract. 3) That an additional surcharge in the amount of \$28,614 related to increased material and tariff costs is hereby approved, and the original contract amount is amended accordingly. Payment shall be made to Ascendance Truck Centers, Davenport, Iowa. 4) This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Dickson that the following resolution (28-2026) be approved. All Ayes.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the table of organization for the Auditor's Office be decreased by 1.0 FTE Finance Generalist (total 0 FTE). 2) That the table of organization for the Auditor's Office be increased by 1.0 FTE Payroll Specialist (total 2.0 FTE). 3) This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Dickson that the following resolution (29-2026) be approved. All Ayes.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) Human Resources Policy D "Classification and Compensation" updates include allowing for an adjustment to a department's table of organization due to a change in personnel or a vacancy and clarifying when step-up pay is applicable in a fiscal year for intermittent and continuous assignments. 2) This resolution shall take effect immediately.

Moved by Beck, seconded by Dickson that the following resolution (30-2026) be approved. All Ayes.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the request to approve a one-year renewal of a 28E agreement with the Iowa DOT for use of real property is approved. 2) That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Moved by Beck, seconded by Dickson a motion to approve the TIF letter for LeClaire. All Ayes.

County Administrator Mahesh Sharma presented his report next. He noted UCC continuing to discuss pending legislation, there are approximately 180 bills pending review. He reviewed the County budget sessions, SECC meetings, and Grow Quad Cities. He also reviewed a health benefit team meeting and the Bettendorf State of the City Address.

Budget and Administrative Services Director David Farmer presented financial updates, including the monthly dashboard. He noted that the dashboard reflects the recently approved amendment. He also reviewed historical data from previous years and the factors driving those changes.

Supervisor Paustian reviewed a transportation meeting and an upcoming EMA meeting.

Supervisor Beck reported on the City Assessor's meeting, noting that Nick Van Camp is up for reappointment this year. He also reviewed a meeting with Nahant Marsh that included discussion of flood control efforts and educational programming. Additionally, he noted that the Quad City Symphony is pursuing grant funding to construct a facility on the former YMCA site.

Supervisor Dickson reviewed a Workforce Development CEO meeting, SCRA, Bettendorf State of the City and Bi-State. She also reviewed UCC activity, noting and thanking departments for input related to proposed legislation.

Supervisor Maxwell reviewed the Chamber meeting, the Bettendorf State of the City address, and the Bi-State meeting. He also reviewed SECC meetings, which included discussions of call volume, pending legislative bills, and their potential impact on County agencies.

Supervisor Bribresco reviewed the Bettendorf State of the City. She also noted she would not be joining during the closed session.

Supervisor Maxwell reviewed an upcoming Special Committee of the Whole on Tuesday, March 3<sup>rd</sup> at 8:30 AM for FY27 Budget Discussion at the East Annex, 500 W 4<sup>th</sup> Street.

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Beck at 5:25 p.m. a motion to close the meeting for discussion of strategy for labor negotiations with Scott County's organized employees pursuant to Iowa Code Section 20.17(3). All Ayes.

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Paustian at 5:46 p.m. a motion to reconvene in open session. All Ayes.

Moved by Dickson, seconded by Paustian at 5:46 p.m. a motion to adjourn. All Ayes.
