

Scott County Board of Supervisors
March 12, 2026 5:00 p.m.

The Board of Supervisors met pursuant to adjournment with Paustian, Beck, Bribriesco, Dickson and Beck present. The Board recited the Pledge of Allegiance.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Bribriesco a motion approving the minutes of the February 24, 2026 Committee of the Whole and the February 26, 2026 Board Meeting. All Ayes.

Upon review of the agenda Supervisor Dickson asked to separate Item #17 into two separate items, leaving item #17 Sheriff compensation and creating a new #18 for County Attorney Compensation.

David Ezra Sidran, 1502 Clay St., Davenport, addressed the Board regarding Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests and Iowa public records law.

Tiffany Licht, 22 Park Crest Ct., Park View, addressed the Board regarding golf cart usage in Park View.

Chad Gephart, Davenport (no address provided), addressed the Board regarding an alleged violation of rights.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Bribriesco a motion to open a Public Hearing relative to adopting amendments to Chapter 29 of the Scott County Code of Ordinances. All Ayes.

No one addressed the Board.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Bribriesco a motion to close the Public Hearing. All Ayes.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Bribriesco that the following five consent agenda items be approved. All Ayes.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) Scott County purchased Lots 1 and 2 of Blackhawk Hills 4th Addition to the City of Eldridge, Scott County, Iowa, in 2015, and maintains the Scott County Sheriff's Patrol Headquarters on said property; 2) Said property was previously platted as Lot 3 of Blackhawk Hills 2nd Addition, and prior to that platted as Lot 3 of Blackhawk Hills 1st Addition; 3) To satisfy City of Eldridge Stormwater Detention requirements associated with the development of Blackhawk Hills 1st Addition, a stormwater detention basin was designed and constructed on Outlot C of said 1st Addition, which was later replatted as Outlot C of Blackhawk Hills 2nd Addition; 4) Original Blackhawk Hills 1st Addition platting documents from 2005 indicate ownership and maintenance responsibilities for Outlot C was to be transferred to an association of landowners; 5) Said landowners association was not created, and ownership of Outlot C was transferred from original developer Cedar Development LLC /Cedar Holdings LLC to VMI-Black Hawk Hills/Terrace Ridge LLC in 2010; 6) Upon discovery of this discrepancy, VMI-Black Hawk Hills/Terrace Ridge LLC as the current owner of Outlot C

of Blackhawk Hills 2nd Addition desires to create a landowners association and transfer ownership of and maintenance responsibilities for said Outlot C to said landowners association; 7) Scott County, as a landowner within the Blackhawk Hills Additions, along with some but not all Blackhawk Hills Additions landowners, has been asked to participate in said landowners association, and for said landowners association to take ownership of and assume maintenance responsibilities for Outlot C of Blackhawk Hills 2nd Addition; 8) Scott County would maintain permanent membership on the Board of Directors of the landowners association for as long as Scott County owns land within the Blackhawk Hills Additions; 9) The Scott County Board of Supervisors agrees to participate in said landowners association and as such assume a proportionate responsibility for the maintenance costs associated with said Outlot C; 10) The Scott County Board of Supervisors directs the Director of the Department of Facilities and Support Services or their designee to serve as the County's representative on the Board of Directors of the landowners association, and grants said representative authority to vote on behalf of the Scott County Board of Supervisors on matters before the Board of Directors in accordance with established Scott County Policies. 11) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (31-2026)

A motion to approve the quarterly financial reports from various county offices for FY26 2nd quarter.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The County will hold a hearing of the property tax asking on Thursday March 26, 2026, at 4:45 PM. 2) The hearing will take public comments on Countywide requested dollars of countywide services of \$66,852,499 and \$5.93331 rate per \$1,000 of taxable valuation. Public comments of requested of \$3,721,335 rural tax levy and an additional rate of \$2.87314, total of \$8.80645 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation shall also be received. 3) The County Auditor has received this information to prepare the required mailings by the required date. The County has posted this notice on the County website and social media and in the Quad City Times and North Scott Press as of March 11, 2026. 4) This resolution shall take effect immediately. (32-2026)

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) That the re-appointment of Shelie Kirby to the Benefited Fire District #3 for a three (3) year term, expiring on April 1, 2029 is hereby approved. 2) That the re-appointment of Kim Brockmann to the Benefited Fire District #4 for a three (3) year term, expiring on April 1, 2029 is hereby approved. 3) That the re-appointment of Meg Flenker to the Benefited Fire District #2 for a three (3) year term, expiring on March 10, 2029 is hereby approved. 4) That the re-appointment of Myron Schiebe to the Zoning Board of Adjustment for a five (5) year term, expiring on May 01, 2031 is hereby approved. 5) That the appointment of Timothy Feeney to the Davenport City Assessor Examining Board for a six (6) year term expiring on March 13, 2032 is hereby approved. 6) This resolution shall take effect immediately. BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The Scott County Board of Supervisors approves for payment all warrants numbered 345913 through 346158 as submitted and prepared for payment by the County Auditor, in the total amount of \$1,712,472.78. 2) The Scott County Board of Supervisors approves for payment all EFT payments as submitted and prepared for

payment by the County Auditor, in the total amount of \$1,337.79. 3) The Board of Supervisors approves for payment to Wells Fargo Bank all purchase card program transactions as submitted to the County Auditor for review in the amount of \$158,761.26. 4) This resolution shall take effect immediately. AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT AMENDMENTS TO CHAPTER 29 OF THE SCOTT COUNTY CODE TO AMEND CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS RELATED TO ISSUANCE OF MUNICIPAL INFRACTION CITATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF SCOTT COUNTY, IOWA:

Section 1. Amend the following sections of Chapter 29, SCOTT COUNTY CODE, 2022.

29-3 CIVIL CITATIONS

Section 2. Amend certain portions of Section 29-3 CIVIL CITATIONS to read as follows:

REPLACE 29-3.B.1 to read as follows: The name and address of the alleged violator;

Section 3. Validity and Severability

Should any section or provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole, or any part thereof other than the part so declared to be invalid.

Section 4. Repealer

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 5. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effective after its final passage and publication as by law provided.

table of organization for MEDIC EMS be increased by 1.0 FTE Vehicle Safety Technician (total 1.0 FTE). 4) That the table of organization for MEDIC be increased by 2.0 FTE EMT (total 29.80 FTE) and decreased by 1.0 FTE EMT/Prebiller (total 0 FTE) and decreased by 1.0 FTE Paramedic/Payroll Clerk (total 0 FTE). 5) That the table of organization for the Sheriff's Office be increased by 1.0 FTE Sheriff's Sergeant (total 10 FTE) and decreased by 1.0 FTE Sheriff's Deputy (total 40 FTE). 6) That table of organization for the Youth Justice Rehabilitation Center be increased by .5 FTE Correctional Health Nurse (total 1.0 FTE). 7) That the table of organization for the Facilities and Support Services Department be decreased by 14.52 FTE Custodian (total 0 FTE). 8) That the table of organization for Facilities and Support Services be decreased by 1.0 FTE Custodial Supervisor (total 0 FTE). 9) This resolution shall take effect July 1, 2026 for sections 1-6, and sections 7 and 8 are effective immediately.

BE IT RESOLVED: 1) The salary ranges for County positions included in the non-represented group shall be adjusted on July 1, 2026 by increasing the salary range by three and a half (3.5%) percent cost of living adjustment. 2) For the purpose of determining an hourly rate of pay for the non-represented group, the annual base salary shall be divided by 2,080 hours, 2,184 hours, or 3,328 hours based on classification. 3) The top of the salary schedule for Seasonal Health Worker, Planning Intern, Budget Intern and Seasonal Maintenance Worker (Roads) in the Z schedule of the pay plan shall be increased by three and a half (3.5%) percent cost of living adjustment. 4) The hourly rate for the part-time Public Health Nurse for the Immunization Clinic, Correctional Health Nurse for Jail Health, and Public Health Dental Hygienist in the Z schedule of the pay plan shall be increased by three and a half (3.5%) percent cost of living adjustment. 5) This resolution shall take effect July 1, 2026.

Moved by Paustian, seconded by Bribriesco at 5:21 p.m. a motion to adjourn. All Ayes.
